All pupils at both the schools have made progress across the year and we have seen fantastic outcomes across all areas of our curriculum. There have been some notable external achievements for both schools, with Park House achieving the Wellbeing Award and Healthy Schools Award (Bronze) and Tram House applying for certification for the TfL Stars Award. There have also been successful collaborations with new and existing partner organisations, most notably at Tram House with Rosslyn Park Rugby Club.

Since January, the Sixth Formers have been settling in well to their new site and are making exceptional progress. The new site has offered new facilities, greater space for lessons and the opportunity to create an age-appropriate environment. Sarah has been one of the biggest driving forces behind Park House's success. Over the years she has made a huge impact as a TLP, Designated Safeguarding Person, Teacher and now Assistant Head. Sarah will greatly be missed but there is comfort in knowing that she will continue working in SEND and will continue empowering and providing the best education possible for learners in her new School.

Throughout the school year, we have also welcomed new staff to BeyondAutism, including the successful introduction of a graduate scheme. We are so thrilled with the way in which new staff have embraced our services and along with all of our staff have worked tirelessly in the best interest of our pupils. This term, Tram House pupils have been practising their rugby skills with Rosslyn Park, who run weekly sessions for our pupils at the local park.


The lessons are a great opportunity for pupils to spend some quality time outdoors working on various skills as well as being an important boost for their health and wellbeing.




Pride month

BeyondAutism Professional Conference

This year we held our professional conference in person for the first time, on 20th and 21st June, at the University of Suffolk.

Our theme, around the realities of inclusion of autistic and disabled individuals in society, brought together a unique mix of researchers, practitioners and those with lived experience. This resulted in an event that delved deep into the theme across multiple sections of society with a focus on what changes we can make to improve the situation.

With over 50% of our speakers bringing their own lived experiences, it led to some great discussions: how real is the picture we have of inclusion, why is the system set up that to get support you need an assessment or diagnosis, how can we make the huge cultural and mindset shift so that we see difference as a positive, and have environments that are set up to enable all to succeed.
